Founded in 2010, ToxIC is a multicenter toxicosurveillance and research network under the auspices of ACMT. ToxIC has been managing and adapting its registry to serve as a database for public health surveillance and emerging exposures within the field of toxicology.

Data collection includes information on drugs of abuse, pediatric marijuana and opioid exposures, envenomations, plant and mushroom poisoning, fentanyl analog exposures, and adverse drug events to COVID-19 treatments.


